שמע בני- מהשנתן שהקב"ה למשה בכתב ועל פה.

אמן- אומנתך כנסת ישראל. להם דברי סופרים שחדשו והוסיפו ועשו סייגים לתורה.

Hear the instruction- This refers to what God gave Moshe in writing and orally

The Torah of your mother- That is, the Nation of Israel. These are the words of our sages who renewed and added to the Torah and created fences to the Torah.

For a women is wise. She teaches her children the upright path.
